REPORT ON ROADS AND DITCHES

The Trustees have devoted many hours to investigating and discussing in the monthly Board meetings the condition of our roads and ditches. Road repair has been accomplished under the leadership of John Hagen while David Pena has been reporting on poor ditch maintenance in the Village.

Village ordinances require residents to keep ditches adjoining their property free of vegetation that can hinder water flow and scrape the paint on cars driving down some of our streets. The Board is sending notices to residents reminding them of the ordinance requirements and requesting immediate action to clean ditches of such growth. Notices are also being sent to residents whose property has some form of violation of Ordinance 252 concerned with unsightly appearance of the property.
